During the Summer of 2014 the family of St. Dunstan's welcomed us with open arms, and helped us move from George Community Center in Seattle to room 9 on the lower level. St. Dunstan's was looking for a chapel / prayer place, we had all of the furnishings of our chapel in storage, the Community gave them to St. Dunstan's so you now have a place to get away for prayer and silent time. This space is also used for small group meetings. Our goals at St. Dunstan's for this coming year are to continue in the liturgical and pastoral service we bring, as well as to help enrich the spiritual growth of the congregation. John will continue to work in pastoral care and offer his services in bereavement counseling, as well as being a listening presence for those who need to express issues. Richard will continue his role as Deacon offering educational and liturgical services to the congregation as a member of the clergy with Fr. David, who is our Rector. Anna Maria will contribute by participating in St. Agnes Guild. On September 7, 2014 the Community participated in the Ministry program on Ingathering Sunday, by having a table, staffed by Sr. Susanne Chambers who answered questions about our Community. We plan on participating again in 2015. We gather at St. Dunstan's on the third Friday of every month, starting at 5:30 p.m. for prayer, study, fellowship, and a community pot luck. All of St. Dunstan's family are welcome to "come and see" .

Our new Chapel at St. Dunstans

Dear Paracletians,

This is a preliminary email about the Chapter. The Hotel we are set up in is the Oxford Inn, (the place we normally stay), just down the road from St. Michael's. The following is a brief outline how it will be scheduled:

June 17th: arrival check into the hotel, Meet with other Community members - go to supper.

June 18th: day of recollection, Holy Eucharist, First Vows, Community Renewal of Profession, Reception of Novice, Reception of Friend (Yakima Chapter). Also this day will be spent in Community silent time together, meditation. Members will have the opportunity for visits with Bishop Visitor in the afternoon or as Bp. Nedi agrees to with individuals.

June 19th: Meeting of Chapter of Pentecost 2015 (agenda will follow after I get the input from Professed members).

June 20th: After breakfast and Morning Prayer, depart for home that will get us all home for the First Day of Summer and Father's Day! (Pentecost Sunday this year is May 24th - so we all will be in our home parish for the Celebration).

In regard to the hotel: The reservation is under the name: Community of the Paraclete; they DO NOT TAKE CASH, use a credit card; ten rooms are being held for us, breakfast is included; the person who has arranged this for us is from their sales department - her name is Sari Bender.

To make your reservation call 509-457-9000, give the dates (June 17, 18,19) and the Name of the Community.

I will have a room held for Bp. Nedi on my bill. This is my financial contribution to the Chapter, food and meals will have to be picked up by other members of the Community. The GOOD NEWS IS: The room rate per night is \$84 for double and 82 for single Queen bed !! (taxes are additional). That is a very good rate!

Transportation to Yakima - you will have to arrange it for yourself, or contact Br. Douglas about pooling with others from Seattle.

In 2015 we are going to do more visitations in the Diocese to help people understand the role Religious Life plays in the Episcopal Church.




Priory changes and moves
